### Procedure Video Report Submission Guidelines – Summary

#### Introduction:

This document summarizes the key requirements and recommendations for submitting a Procedure Video Report to the AABIP 2026 Annual Meeting.

#### Format for Procedure Video Reports:

**\*\*Written Report (max 300 words, excluding title/authors):\*\***

1. **Title** (up to 25 words)
2. **Introduction, Procedure Description and Conclusion** (~300 words)
3. **References** (within the 300-word limit)

#### Video Submission Guidelines:

- **Maximum length:** 2 minutes preferably in HD
- **Format:** MP4 only
- **Resolution:** 1920×1080 (1080p HD); do not compress
- **Upload:** Via the Procedure Video Upload Tab
- **Content:** Authors should not put your name or affiliations on the video. Authors are required to put the title at the beginning of the video. The video should explain the procedure in enough detail with the use of text, arrows, highlights or other visual callouts, making the content fully self-explanatory. The video should visually complement your written report, focusing on the key aspects of the procedure.
- **Quality:** Use text overlays, arrows, and labels to clarify visuals
- **Sound:** No audio or music permitted
- **Ethics:** Third party video editing assistance is not allowed. The authors must be the sole creators of the video content. If a video is taken that includes a patient, prior consent is required.

## Review and Selection Process:

1. All submissions will be reviewed for adherence to guidelines, content quality, and educational value.
2. The review committee will select videos based on clarity, relevance, and contribution to the field.

## Tips for a Strong Submission:

- Choose a title that is concise and descriptive.
- Keep the introduction focused on the clinical relevance or problem being addressed.
- Use the Procedure Description to highlight unique steps or innovations.
- Maintain high video quality, proper lighting, and clear surgical visuals.
- Use text overlays to guide viewers since audio is prohibited.
- Ensure all materials comply strictly with formatting and timing requirements.
- Emphasize educational value and practical insights.
